Temperature How-To

Bell-Young Hall is a large building with many windows. To keep the temperature comfortable, we recommend setting the thermostat to 68°F during the day and 75°F at night. This helps reduce energy costs and keeps the air quality good.

In Bell-Young Hall, the temperature is controlled by a central air conditioning system. If you notice the temperature is not what you need, please contact the REHS staff. We will investigate and make adjustments as needed. If you have any questions, please call us at 302-330-3000.

Temperature Tips

Need to cool down?

- Keep your windows closed during the day. Open them at night to let the cool air in.
- Fans can help circulate the air. Use ceiling fans and portable fans. Be sure to clean them regularly.
- Check your thermostat settings. Make sure it is set to the correct temperature.
